



CULTURE CONVERSATIONS:

REFLECTIONS, DISCUSSIONS, AND EXPERIENCES TO ENRICH THE LIVES OF LEHIGH VALLEY TEENS

Announcing a collaboration between **The Bach Choir of Bethlehem** and **Allentown Symphony Orchestra**, offering a community youth engagement program that culminates in free attendance to concerts featuring emerging artists as well as world-renowned artists Yo-Yo Ma and Kathryn Stott.

These concerts will serve as catalyst to invite teens to discuss what inspires them and to prompt conversations about the relevance of cultural activities in their future.

HOW YOU CAN HELP!

We're asking music, art, and theatre teachers from around the Lehigh Valley to share the invitation to participate in the Culture Conversations (CC) program with your students. Interested students will answer a brief survey and write a short essay on what they hope to achieve through fully participating in the program. Deadline for applications is February 28, 2022.



THE PROGRAM

We're encouraging robust representation of teen voices from around the community, and wish to invite as many students to each conversation as possible.

Google Classroom / VIRTUAL sessions: Preparation for each session will involve reading selected materials and/or videos to view prior to conversation. Virtual Sessions will be held live at 8pm. If a student cannot attend the virtual session, they may view an archive recording. We strongly encourage attendance at the live sessions for engaging conversations among the participants and leaders.

Students will submit responses to each session online, including short answer surveys and brief written responses to prompted questions. These should not take more than thirty minutes.



Two teen reporters, Sophie Eljovich and Kyra Kelly, from WDIY 88.1FM may follow-up with participants between each session for further interviews. WDIY will broadcast these interviews on the **Teen Connect** program.

SAMPLE REFLECTIONS

Discuss your thoughts on the following statements:



- Culture is important to me.
- I feel there are multiple opportunities to experience other cultures in this area.
- I am curious to learn about other cultures.
- In a few sentences, tell us about any new insights you gained from this session.
- What (if any) barriers stop you from participating in live cultural experiences?
- How have cultural experiences improved, expanded or enhanced your development as a person or as an artist?

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

March 13 / 14: ASO Concert: BOLÉRO – tickets given to all participants who complete a response to Section 1 of the program. Special "Meet and Greet" with cellist, Gabriel Martins.

April 30: Yo-Yo Ma and Kathryn Stott – Each student who attends and completes each virtual session and completes the responses prior to April 1, who also commits to completing the entire program, will be considered by random selection to receive a free ticket to the April 30 Yo-Yo Ma and Kathryn Stott Concert. Because this program is engaging youth, tickets will be offered only to teens, not to parents, adult drivers or chaperons. ID and proof of vaccination required at the door.
