GALA - 125TH ANNIVERSARY CONCERT - A Groundbreaking Performance

THIS YEAR, THE BACH CHOIR CELEBRATES

125 years of inspiring audiences through the power of music. As part of the celebration, we're honored to announce our annual Gala Concert and Fundraiser on November 4, 2023, featuring the global premiere performance of the new scholarly edition of Felix Mendelssohn's interpretation of J.S. Bach's Saint Matthew Passion. This groundbreaking event marks yet another "first" for The Bach Choir and the world of classical music, celebrating our milestone anniversary and helping us raise funds for our community and youth engagement programs, such as Bach to School, Bach at Noon, and the Bel Canto Youth Chorus.



The 2023 Gala Concert is certain to be a historic event and not one to be missed! This performance will feature the distinguished Bach Choir and Bach Festival Orchestra, as well as renowned international soloists at Packer Memorial Church, Lehigh University

campus. To honor both The Choir's anniversary and this extraordinary performance, the concert will be recorded live and released on the Analekta label in spring 2024.

CHRISTMAS CONCERTS - A Consonance of Anniversaries by David Rulhf

THIS YEAR'S CHRISTMAS CONCERTS are wrapped in all sorts of anniversary consonance: It is the 300th anniversary of Bach's first Christmas at the Thomaskirche in Leipzig, and the repertoire we are singing includes

two works Bach incorporated in the liturgical goings-on for his first year there: Cantata 63 and the *Magnificat*. This year also marks the 35th anniversary of the release of The Choir's 1988 recording, *Christmas in Leipzig*, which includes the fanfares and dances of Cantata 63. Cantata 63 will be heard in its entirety at this year's Christmas concerts.

Our Kapellmeister, Christopher Jackson, has put together an amazing program! Both works include Bach at his most unrestrainedly festive. In the infectiously joyful, vivid *Magnificat*, the song of Mary from St. Luke's Gospel (1:46-55), Bach crafts each line of Mary's hymn with tremendous photorealism, each movement a jewel of lucid and evocative beauty. From the effervescent choruses to the stunningly devout "Suscepit Israel," a trio of women's voices accompanied by continuo and oboe, Bach writes with great sweep and drama. Likewise,

in Cantata 63, some of Bach's most delightfully pompous trumpet fanfares are coupled with jaw-droppingly virtuosic writing for strings and winds (along with exhilarating singing from The Choir). This cantata also includes one of Bach's most striking accompanied recitatives for alto and one of his loveliest bass/soprano duets. Joining The Choir will be a fabulous quintet of soloists, including soprano Molly Quinn, who makes a longanticipated Bethlehem debut.

This year's program also includes what we hope will be the establishment of a thrilling new Bethlehem tradition: the commissioning of a carol for the Christmas Concerts. We hope you'll join us to share in both the quiet devotion and radiant exultation of these timeless works. We're delighted to share the tremendous gifts of our heritage and offer something beautiful from our very exciting here and now!

Dear Friends:



IT IS HARD FOR ME TO BELIEVE, but I have now completed one revolution around the sun as the new Artistic Director and Conductor of The Bach Choir of Bethlehem. One year is certainly not enough time to learn all there is to know about this organization, its incredible community, board, staff, volunteers, and patrons, or its seemingly limitless

potential. I feel a massive sense of gratitude and joy as I reflect on the past year and, simultaneously, an intense excitement about the years to come.

This May's Bach Festival, my first, was the perfect culminating event. Performances by The Choir, Loretta O'Sullivan, Bach Festival Orchestra, our fine soloists, and Bel Canto were memorable not just because of their skill but even more so due to their intense focus and commitment. I am certain that our audiences could feel this too, and they responded in kind, fully investing in each concert and in each performer. This creates a special atmosphere – a type of electricity – that is what every conductor hopes for.

I was not fully prepared for the overwhelming dedication and support of the Festival audiences and our Guarantors. I spoke to many people for whom this was their 50th (or more!) Festival; I met Guarantors who traveled from another continent to welcome me in my first outing; I spent time with families, some with now three generations that have come to witness the power of this Festival. It was humbling. It gave me a sense of perspective about the role that The Bach Choir plays in the lives of our

visitors and the history of our shared culture. I must say, though, that most humbling of all was the love and respect shown to me by The Choir and Orchestra after my first *B Minor Mass*. I have rarely been so moved. This year's Festival is a moment that I will continue to treasure personally for decades to come.

This year, we have two milestone projects for The Bach Choir: the recording of Mendelssohn's *Saint Matthew* and our upcoming European tour. Expect to hear more Mendelssohn throughout the year, as we get to know the man largely responsible for the revival of Bach's music in the 19th century. We are also celebrating historic anniversaries, such as Bach's first Christmas in Leipzig, by performing his *Magnificat* and BWV 63, *Christen ätzet diesen Tag* at our Christmas Concert – the very same music Bach performed 300 years ago.

The overwhelming sense of support and welcome that I have received from this entire community is absolutely extraordinary. And this community has affirmed the central reason that I chose to make a life in music and to dedicate myself to The Bach Choir of Bethlehem: There is no other more life-affirming pursuit than people gathering together to seek beauty or truth, create community, and serve something greater than themselves. It is with great confidence that I say The Bach Choir of Bethlehem have these qualities in abundance. It is an honor to be here. There is so much more to come.

OUR INVITATION TO PERFORM AT BACHFEST IN LEIPZIG and to have our concert featured in the eminent Thomaskirche is a singular honor. This is the church that was home to the bulk of Bach's creative choral output and is something of a mecca for all Bach enthusiasts. To say that this tour is a holy pilgrimage for us is no exaggeration. As great an achievement as this is for The Bach Choir, our tour will have many more life-changing and unforgettable moments. On this trip, we will also travel to and sing in Potsdam, home to Frederick the Great, King of Prussia, and C.P.E. Bach; Schwäbisch Gmünd, Bethlehem's sister city; and the birthplace of Mozart, the beautiful gem of Austria, Salzburg. We will even pay a special visit to Herrnhut, the German "home" of our Moravian heritage.

In 2024, the theme of the famous BachFest in Leipzig is WE ARE FAMILY. We are honored that The Bach Choir is one of 18 Bach choirs on six continents invited to give a featured performance of Bach Cantatas in the Thomaskirche, the church in Leipzig where Bach was the cantor from 1723–1750 and is buried.

This is our first international tour since 2003, and The Choir has not performed in Germany since 1995. The Choir will broaden its audience, gain increased international recognition, receive irre-placeable musical inspiration, and build unforgettable memories and friendships with world-wide Bach organizations.

This concert is the culmination of over five years of meticulous research by eminent musicologist Malcolm Bruno. Bruno's work specializes in Baroque and choral repertoire. He is equally known in the classical music recording world and will serve as producer for the live recording. Reflecting on this collaboration, Bruno stated, "As Mendelssohn's vision of Bach's Saint Matthew Passion, it is particularly well suited to The Bach Choir of Bethlehem, the kind of 'Bach' choir for which Mendelssohn would have longed, but which, alas in his lifetime, he never experienced." The performance coincides with the publication of this new edition

by Bärenreiter, the world's most respected classical music publisher.

Leela Breithaupt, Executive Director, said, "The opportunity to premiere and record this scholarly edition of Mendelssohn's version of Bach's iconic work continues our legacy of premiering significant Bach-centric works in the United States since 1900."

Around 700 attendees are anticipated at the Gala Concert, and a group of 150 Benefactors will attend an exclusive dinner and fundraiser at the Saucon Valley Country Club after the concert that will benefit The Choir's Educational and Community Engagement programs. Your

This ambitious plan was constructed on the foundation of seven guiding principles:

- 2. Excellence: Striving for unparalleled quality in every activity.
- 3. Traditions and Innovation: Celebrating our deep-rooted traditions while fostering innovation to grow and evolve.
- 4. Engagement: Creating meaningful interactions and connections with our audiences.
- Inclusion: Ensuring that diversity is not just respected but celebrated.
- 6. Skillful Execution: Striving for the highest standards in both artistry and organization.
- 7. Responsible Stewardship: Safeguarding the resources and trust bestowed upon us.

FOCUS AREAS AND GOALS

After careful deliberation and a series of Board and staff planning sessions, three core areas and goals emerged as pillars of our plan:

- Artistic Programming and Performance: Taking our artistry to new heights and enhancing excellence.

115th FESTIVAL WRAP-UP – Conductor Jackson's Inaugural Festival by Ebony Stevens

THE 115TH BETHLEHEM BACH FESTIVAL, held on May 12-13 and 19-20, was a remarkable conclusion to our 2022-2023 season and marked the inaugural festival of The Bach Choir's Artistic Director and Conductor, Dr. Christopher Jackson. With a return to a full Festival format, the first time all events and concerts were held in person since Festival 2019, and the atmosphere was vibrant and full of gratitude. Festival audiences were visibly moved as they were able to finally experience the return of muchloved programming.

One of the many highlights of the festival was the Barnette Distinguished Scholar Lecture, which focused on the 2005 discovery of the J.S. Bach Aria Alles mit Gott, BWV 1127 by Dr. Michael Maul, researcher at the Bach Archive in Leipzig and Artistic Director of the annual Leipzig Bachfest. A recording of Dr. Maul's lecture was sent to all Guarantors via email in June with our gratitude for their continued support.

Bach at 4 included Bach's early-career cantata Aus der Tiefen ruf ich, Herr, zu dir, BWV 131. Artist-in-Residence, Loretta O'Sullivan, delivered a powerful performance of C.P.E. Bach's Cello Concerto in A Minor, Wq 170, at Bach at 8. The concert concluded with J.S. Bach's poignant cantata Ich hatte viel Bekümmernis in meinem Herzen, BWV 21.

Listeners at the Ifor Jones Memorial Chamber Music concert were treated to a special world premiere performance of



Remember, composed by Bel Canto Youth Chorus member Julia Sobrinski. Uniting the worlds of music and poetry, this beautiful piece of music was crafted around a poem by Joy Harjo. Cellists Loretta O'Sullivan and Deborah Davis masterfully performed Vivaldi's Concerto for Two Cellos in G Major, RV 531.

The 115th Festival concluded with a grand finale performance of Bach's Mass in B Minor. The passionate delivery of this monumental work earned an overwhelming roar of approval from the audience and Choir alike. Choir member Anthony Villani lauded Dr. Jackson's leadership: "I just wanted you to know that the roar of approval from the audience and Choir for your stellar performance and leadership was richly deserved! Your hard work and energetic leadership helped to push us to perform at an extremely high level!" The palpable emotion in the air was captured by the livestream performance for audiences at home to experience extending our Bach Choir community.

GERMAN-AMERICAN TIES by Leela Breithaupt

AS WE CONTINUE our 125th Anniversary season, the many ties that bind The Bach Choir to Germany are strong. From the rich musical traditions of the Moravian Church in Herrnhut and Bachfest in Leipzig, to the revitalization of the Sister City relationship with Schwäbisch-Gmünd, The Choir continues to create a bridge between

Bethlehem and Germany through music.

This past summer, Christopher, Phil Turton, and I visited each of the five cities that The Bach Choir will sing in during our 2024 European Tour. During our visit to Herrnhut, Christopher was welcomed into the community and ended up being invited to sing side by side with the Herrnhuters in an impromptu performance for the community on the green in front of the Moravian Church.

Our talks with the church leaders were fruitful – from inviting the school for special needs students to our Singstunde to walking through God's Acre and seeing the Moravians buried along side non-Moravians just as in Bethlehem, the power of human connection was ever-present.

The connection continued with our visit to Schwäbisch-Gmünd, Bethlehem's Sister City. There, Mayor Arnold warmly welcomed us for a champagne reception on a 100-degree day in the city hall and spoke eloquently of the importance and meaning of building strong ties with Bethlehem. The next day, the headline in the newspaper read, "Music as a Rejuvenation for the Partnership with Bethlehem." This partnership has fostered a profound bond, nurturing cultural exchange and understanding. The Bach Choir was equally delighted to host a delegation from Schwäbisch-Gmünd, including the Mayor and City Council members in August for a Bach at Noonstyle performance as a part of Musikfest.

On this side of the Atlantic, The Choir has been fortunate to be invited to several

meaningful events. From our meeting with Consulate General of Germany David Gill in New York City to attending the official opening ceremony of the Moravian exhibition at the German House in NYC, and our strong connections with German American companies such as HYDAC and B Braun, The Choir is a part of the fabric of the larger German-American community.

In April, The Bach Choir had the privilege of participating in the delegation visit of the Minister President of Saxony. We were honored to perform a special mini *a cappella* performance in the sanctuary of Central Moravian Church. Bishop Hopeton Clennon's gracious invitation allowed us to come together through singing and build bridges between cultures. During this visit, the Minister President conveyed to us the anticipation and excitement surrounding The Bach Choir's upcoming performance at the Leipzig Bachfest in 2024.

Among the many memorable moments of our recent Bethlehem Bach Festival, the Barnette Distinguished Scholar Lecturer Dr. Michael Maul kept listeners on the seat of their chairs with his tale of the discovery of an original Bach aria in a dusty old German church near Weimar as a 26-year-old. Dr. Maul has plenty of experience with Bach Festivals as the Artistic Director of the Leipzig Bachfest, yet he was very impressed with our Bethlehem Bach Festival performances and events. Overwhelmed with emotion, Dr. Maul praised the unity and community spirit of The Bach Choir. He expressed his awe at the audience's ability to sing the chorales in four-part harmony, highlighting how this shared experience transcended language, religion, culture, politics, and geography. Dr. Maul's words reminded us of the profound impact choral music can have on our lives and its ability to bring people together.
